Remembrance

"Curt Nelson"



It is with great sadness that we announce the passing of Curt Nelson on December 14, 2021. Curt was a life member of Trout Unlimited and served as President of the Thames Valley Chapter. He was also a member of the TU State Council and the Fisheries Advisory Board. Curt was a founding member of the ConnRI Coastal Flyfishers, a member of the Atlantic Salmon Federation and the past Fish & Game Chair of the Westbrook Fishing Club.

Curt made many trips to pursue trout, salmon,

steelhead, bonefish, and stripers in his long flyfishing life. He made seventeen trips to New Zealand; annual trips to the Miramichi River in New Brunswick, Canada; and a frequent visitor to Belize and Spanish Wells, Bahamas.

There were few anglers that could read the water like Curt; he was an accomplished angler and particularly well-known for his ability to catch Atlantic salmon. He was also an expert fly tier and knew a good road kill when he saw one to add to his tying materials.





Curt will be missed by all his fellow anglers and the associations made during his many years of pursuing the sport. He was generous, engaging and had a great sense of humor.

Featuring Tim Flagler - Tightline Productions

Tim's presentation will be on fishing after dark. At certain times of the year, fishing after the sun goes down can be spectacular and the chances of hooking into a monster are better than any other part of the day. Fishing in the dark does take some getting used to but with a few tricks, some basic equipment and minor modifications to technique, it can be an absolute blast. The presentation will include a wealth of video shot recently and over the last couple of years and yes, it includes plenty of big fish.



Tim Flagler is the owner of Tightline Productions, L.L.C., a video production company located in Califon, NJ. Although he produces video programs over a wide range of topics, his specialty is fly fishing. Tim is a well-known fly tying instructor. His YouTube videos are some of the best in the business and his YouTube channel, <u>practicalpatterns.com</u> currently has over 92,000 subscribers and almost 28 million views. Almost every week he produces a

new fly tying or "how to" video which appear not only on his YouTube channel but on Midcurrent and the Orvis fly fishing blog as well. They're also featured on Trout Unlimited's national website and in the Orvis Learning Center. In addition, he has a regular column "Beginner's Masterclass with Tim Flagler" in Fly Tyer magazine. Many of his tying videos take the viewer well beyond just the tying of the fly and show what it looks like underwater, what natural it represents and how it can be fished.

Tim's a fixture at the Fly Fishing Shows - giving presentations, teaching classes and often as a Featured Tier. He enjoys guiding year round for Shannon's Fly & Tackle in Califon, NJ. and hosts annual trips to Patagonia in the spring and to the Kootenai River in MT starting summer of 2020.



Participants will learn about the basic tools and techniques needed to successfully tie flies. Patterns selected will be easier for beginners and cover the key fundamental skills for tying most flies. Each class will normally involve the students tying 2 - 3 different patterns and usually 4 or more flies per session depending on complexity and participant skills. No prior tying experience is needed and subsequent classes would build on skills learned in prior classes. Students are welcome to bring their own tying tools if they have them, but all required tools and materials will be provided for the classes free by Thames Valley Trout Unlimited.




